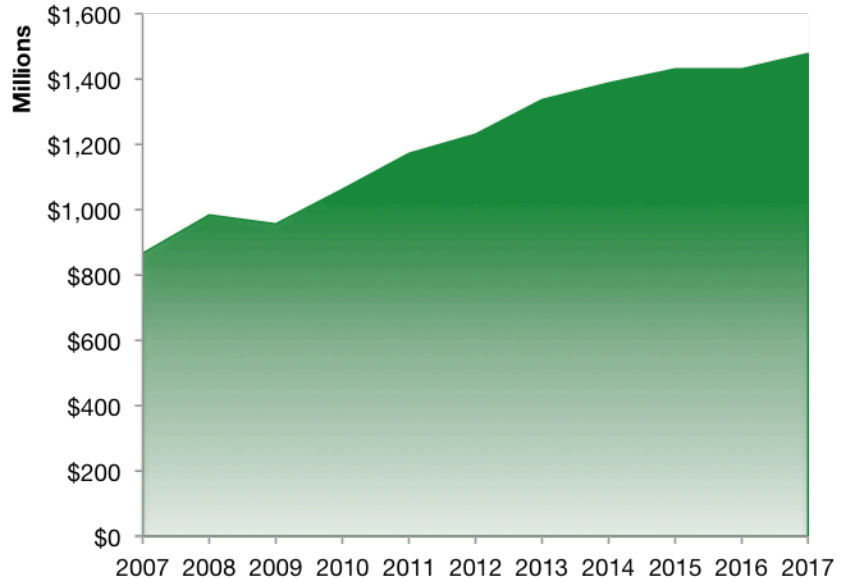
### Maine Services Exports

#### U.S. Services Supply the World

Maine has seen a rise in overall services exports since 2007, boosting state economic growth and jobs, and contributing to the overall U.S. services trade surplus of \$248 billion in 2017.

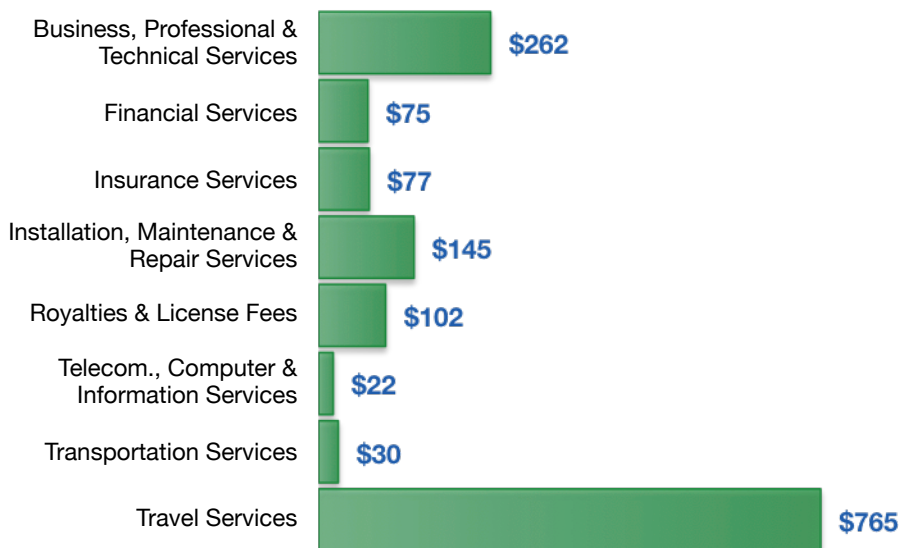

#### Maine Services Exports to Select Countries, 2017

- To China:** \$122 million in services exports supporting 1,060 jobs

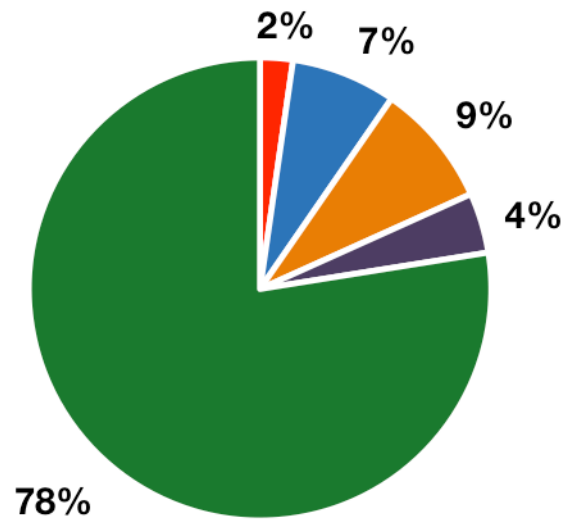

### Services Fuel U.S. Jobs and Growth

Services fuel America's economic growth and jobs, generating more than 77 percent of employment in the United States and 67 percent of GDP. Services are a major component of the manufacturing and agricultural sectors, and they boost the competitiveness of those sectors.

Services accounted for 78 percent of all jobs for Maine workers in 2017. The top services sector for employment was Education, Health Care, & Social Assistance, which alone employed 185,350 Maine workers.
