
U.S. Services Supply the World





Services Fuel U.S. Jobs and Growth

Services fuel America's economic growth and jobs, generating more than 77 percent of employment in the United States and 68 percent of GDP. Services are a major component of the manufacturing and agricultural sectors, and they boost the competitiveness of those sectors.

In WA-1, services accounted for 80 percent of all jobs in 2022. The top services sector for employment was professional, scientific, and management, and administrative, and waste management services, which alone employed 93,700 WA-1 workers.
